Job Brief

We are seeking a dedicated and passionate International Family Placement Social Worker to join our team in Norwich. In this role, you will be responsible for supporting our in-country international project staff with up-to-date family placement information. You will be part of the team developing our digital and online training tool and resource called 'My Family.' You will be competent in delivering workshops on family placement at our international conferences, and able to work cross-culturally as part of an international team of family placement social workers.

Responsibilities include:

 Collaborate with international government authorities, and other stakeholders, on how to facilitate local domestic placements in compliance with all relevant laws and regulations.

- Stay up-to-date with developments in international family placement policies and practices and contribute to the continuous improvement of our training and support.
- Actively contribute to the development of the 'My Family' online training tool.
- Provide regular support to our International Project teams, contributing to quality training delivery.
- Train and support prospective family placement workers.

Requirements and skills

- Bachelor's or master's degree in social work or a related field.
- Previous experience in family placement.
- Strong understanding of child welfare principles and best practices.
- Ability to teach clearly the comprehensive assessment procedures for prospective families, including home visits and interviews.
- Understanding and have knowledge of how to train local staff to work therapeutically with children prior to placement (e.g. 'Life story work').
- Understand the necessary post-placement ongoing support to families and disseminate that to ensure successful transitions and adjustment.
- Have a good knowledge of how to recruit families in their local context and advise local authorities on the necessary checks.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work effectively in a cross-cultural environment
- Proficiency in another language (if applicable) is an advantage
- Valid driver's license and ability to travel domestically and internationally
